Peter Sciliano grew up in West Harrison; he attended Harrison schools and graduated from Harrison High School. He joined the West Harrison Fire Department at the age of 16. Peter served as a line officer and Captain and is a life member.

Peter has been an employee of the Town of Mount Pleasant for over 32 years. During his tenure with the town highway department, he has held multiple positions starting as a Motor Equipment Operator and worked his way up to General Foreman. Upon the retirement of Highway Superintendent Louis Johnson in December 2008, he was appointed Highway Superintendent by the Town Board, and was elected to that position in 2009. He is also chair of the vendor committee and a member of the scholarship committee. In previous years, Peter was the Association Secretary and has held various committee positions. In 2013, he was appointed to the Executive Committee of New York State Town Highway Superintendents Association. In 2009, Peter joined Westchester County Association of Municipal Public Works Administrators, and American Public Works Association.
